Welcome to the 2016 Western Canadian Biathlon Championships and Biathlon Manitoba Provincials. The organizing committee and the Falcon Lake community are excited to have you compete at our newly upgraded facility. The range and trails are a result of many volunteer hours, the efforts of skilled labourers and financial contributions from diverse sources such as The National Trails Coalition.

Located on the shore of beautiful Falcon Lake in the Whiteshell Provincial Park, Falcon Ridge Ski Slopes offers beautiful views of the lake amidst a woodland boreal forest setting. There are over 25 kms of maintained x-country ski trails connecting the local Trans-Canada trail, and Provincial Park. There are trails groomed for both classic (track set) and skate skiing.

While official training begins on February 26, you are welcome to arrive earlier and enjoy the trails. 
## **COMPETITION VENUE**

Falcon Ridge Ski Slopes, Falcon Lake, Manitoba. (Formerly called Falcon Ridge Ski Area)

Our Biathlon facility is situated 500 meters walk from the ski chalet and parking lot. Our range has 20 lanes for use with .22 rifles. We do not have air rifle infrastructure. Our facility has a new athlete warm up building and recently widened trails. Our trail network has over 25 km of trails that surround the downhill ski facility. New ski trails maps and profiles are being uploaded to our Biathlon Manitoba website.

# Directions to the Falcon Ridge Ski Slope facility:



Falcon Ridge Ski Slope is located on the south-east end of Falcon Lake in the Whiteshell Provincial Park in Manitoba. To get there, turn off the Trans Canada Highway at Falcon Lake, about 10 minutes West of the Manitoba/ Ontario border. Once you've turned off the highway, follow the South Shore Road (past the golf course, the lumber yard and the marina) for about 15 minutes. Falcon Ridge is located at the end of this road.

Falcon Ridge is about a two hour drive east from downtown Winnipeg, MB and one hour west of Kenora, ON.

#### **Rental Cars**

For those flying in to Winnipeg, vehicles can be rented at the James Richardson International Airport.

# SHOPPING - Prior to leaving Winnipeg

Groceries: As there are limited groceries available in Falcon Lake, we recommend that you pick up the majority of your groceries in a major center. Winnipeg has many grocery chains such as Safeway. Sobeys, and Real Canadian Superstores.

Ski equipment: Winnipeg has many stores that sell ski gear and wax equipment. The two following locations are on the most direct path from the airport to Falcon Lake.

**Shopping Centre- Polo Park Shopping centre** is the largest shopping centre in Winnipeg. It is located just east of the Route 90 and Portage Ave intersection. Approx 2 km from the airport.

#### SITE INFORMATION

Please note that the Falcon Lake area is a beautiful resort community and most of the services are closed in winter. MAP of townsite and links to businesses. There are limited restaurant and grocery services available.

The closest restaurants are either at the Falcon Lake Hotel or in West Hawk Lake (High Point), which is 10 minutes from the Falcon Lake town site. Given the availability of restaurants in the winter, the ski chalet has prepared special meals for our participants should they wish to preorder. Upon sufficient request, the chalet will stay open late on Saturday night. Please advise competition secretary if you need to order food from the chalet for Saturday supper. The ski hill does offer a varied and delicious selection of entrées during the day.

## Ski Chalet food info:

Food concessions will be available both Saturday and Sunday at Falcon Ridge Ski Slope chalet. Special breakfasts & lunches are being prepared for pre-order at the ski chalet for the Western Championship attendees and may be pre-purchased through zone4.ca on the same page as the registration for competitions. # **MEDALS:**

Biathlon Canadian Western Championships medals will be awarded to Canadian athletes in the following categories:

Men/Women, Junior M/W, Youth M/W, Senior B/G, Junior B/G, Master's M/W. Biathlon Manitoba - MB Cup Provincial medals will be awarded to residents of Biathlon Manitoba boundaries in all classes of competition.

## **RULES:**

The event is held in accordance to IBU rules, <u>Biathlon Canada Hosting Policy</u> 2015 – 2016 Canadian Hosting Policy (Canadian Championships and Eastern and Western Canadian Championships), dated 10 Nov 2015; revised 23 Dec, 2015.

## **CANCELLATION POLICY:**

A 50% refund of Registration Fees will be provided up to three days prior to the event, if it is cancelled due to severe weather. No refund of Registration Fees will be provided if the event is cancelled from February 24-28, 2016, due to severe weather or force majeure.

# **ELIGIBILITY TO PARTICIPATE:**

If correctly registered and entered by their Canadian Division or USBA Region, any member of USBA or Biathlon Canada in good standing may participate in the event if they have a valid USBA or Biathlon Canada Competitor membership.

# **DAY MEMBERSHIPS:**

- 1) A day membership is required for each single day of a biathlon related activity. For example, if you are participating in a two-day event, and you don't have an annual membership, you will be required to purchase two one-day memberships.
- 2) An athlete who is participating with a Day Membership at a MB Cup may only enter the Developmental Class.

# **FIRST AID**

First Aid will be available on site courtesy of the Canadian Ski Patrol.

One of our volunteers is an ER doctor and will be on site during the event.

The doctor's office is open on weekends in Falcon Lake.

The nearest hospitals are in Kenora, Ontario (1 hour) or Ste Anne, Manitoba (1 hour and 10 minutes)

# SENIOR BOYS/GIRLS INTENDING TO COMPETE AS A YOUTH:

A sixteen year old Senior Boy or Senior Girl can elect to compete as Youth Men/Youth Women on a competition-by-competition basis, simply by informing the organizer at time of Entry. We also ask that athletes review new rules for the Non-carry procedure in Annex a-3 of the Canadian Hosting Policy

#### WAXING:

Wax facilities will be available on site (heated wax hut, wax tent and outdoor power outlets).

# **Developmental (DEV) Categories:**

Developmental categories are aimed at athletes who are new to the sport. In this category, rifles are placed on the mat for the athlete. They shoot on standing targets but only from the prone position. Dev athletes are permitted to use a rest.

Dev. Athletes must have competed in at least one biathlon competition this year in order to compete in this event.
